
How do you intend on leveraging from this programme?

What have you learnt so far?



What have you learnt so far?


I learned the basics of Softexpert software used by project managers to track and monitor projects. I learned about the 5 project management life cycles and the 48 processes of the different project knowledge areas.

What have you learnt so far?


